



## COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOL FOR WORSHIP SERVICE PARTICIPANTS

These guidelines have been put in place to ensure the health and safety of all attendees. At this time, WORSHIP SERVICES are limited to 25 people, including staff, musicians, tech support, and so forth.

1. Reservations are required. Make arrangements for your visit to the church by either reserving a spot online, or calling ahead
2. Answer each of these questions:
  - a. Have you had a fever, coughing or other COVID-19 related symptoms in the last 14 days?
  - b. Have you been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19 or someone with symptoms in the last 14 days?
  - c. Are you awaiting COVID-19 test results?
  - d. If you answered YES to any of these questions, please do not visit the church.
3. All attendees must follow all directions from ushers and staff.
  - a. Face coverings are required at all times; physical distancing of at least six feet is also required at all times.
  - b. Congregational singing and passing of the peace is not allowed – yet.
  - c. Use the front entrance only. Wait on the marked spots to maintain six feet of physical distance until it is your turn to enter the church.
  - d. All persons are required to check in when entering the church. This is to facilitate contact tracing should it be needed.
  - e. You will be shown to your assigned seat(s) for worship services; there will be a bulletin in the seat. Enjoy the service in your assigned seat only.
  - f. Attendees are asked to remain seated throughout the service with the exception of using the restroom. The main restrooms in the education wing are the only restrooms to be used during Worship Services.
    - i. Traffic pattern is travel TO restroom via Petersen Gallery and return FROM the restroom via the office wing, following the arrows.
    - ii. No more than two people should be in the restroom at the same time inasmuch as it is possible.
4. At the conclusion of the service traffic volunteers direct attendees to the main doors for exit, facilitating 6 foot physical distancing.
5. There is no mingling or social time in any part of the church for the time being.
