On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them. "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it.
