OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 22:20-26

"Whoever sacrifices to any god other than
the Lord alone shall be devoted to
destruction. "You shall not wrong or
oppress a resident alien, for you were
aliens in the land of Egypt. You shall not
abuse any widow or orphan. If you do
abuse them, when they cry out to me, I will
surely heed their cry; my wrath will burn,
and I will kill you with the sword, and your
wives shall become widows and your
children orphans. "If you lend money to my
people, to the poor among you, you shall
not deal with them as a creditor; you shall
not exact interest from them. If you take
your neighbor's cloak as guarantee, you
shall restore it before the sun goes down,
for it may be your neighbor's only clothing
to use as a cover. In what else shall that
person sleep? And when your neighbor
cries out to me, I will listen, for I am
compassionate.

THE GOSPEL READING

Mark 7:1-15

Now when the Pharisees and some of the
scribes who had come from Jerusalem
gathered around him, they noticed that
some of his disciples were eating with
defiled hands, that is, without washing
them. For the Pharisees, and all the Jews,
do not eat unless they wash their hands,
thus observing the tradition of the elders,
and they do not eat anything from the
market unless they wash, and there are

also many other traditions that they
observe: the washing of cups and pots
and bronze kettles and beds. So the
Pharisees and the scribes asked him,
"Why do your disciples not walk according
to the tradition of the elders but eat with
defiled hands?" He said to them, "Isaiah
prophesied rightly about you hypocrites,
as it is written, 'This people honors me
with their lips, but their hearts are far from
me; in vain do they worship me, teaching
human precepts as doctrines.' "You
abandon the commandment of God and
hold to human tradition." Then he said to
them, "You have a fine way of rejecting
the commandment of God in order to keep
your tradition! For Moses said, 'Honor
your father and your mother,' and,
'Whoever speaks evil of father or mother
must surely die.' But you say that if
anyone tells father or mother, 'Whatever
support you might have had from me is an
offering to God, then you no longer permit
doing anything for a father or mother, thus
nullifying the word of God through your
tradition that you have handed on. And
you do many things like this." Then he
called the crowd again and said to them,
"Listen to me, all of you, and understand:
there is nothing outside a person that by
going in can defile, but the things that
come out are what defile.

THE EPISTLE READING

I Cor. 1:18-21

For the message about the cross is
foolishness to those who are perishing,
but to us who are being saved it is the
power of God. For it is written, "I will
destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the
discernment of the discerning I will
thwart." Where is the one who is wise?
Where is the scholar? Where is the
debater of this age? Has not God made
foolish the wisdom of the world? For
since, in the wisdom of God, the world did
not know God through wisdom, God
decided, through the foolishness of the
proclamation, to save those who believe.
