you to another world, doesn’t it?” “It does
indeed,” I responded in a soft voice, so as
not to overshadow the beauty of the
moment. Music does indeed take us to
another world. Or, more accurately, it points
us there. For me, music is one of those
stimulators of desire that reminds me of
what C.S. Lewis wrote in Mere Christianity,
“If I find in myself a desire which no
experience in this world can satisfy, the
most probable explanation is that I was
made for another world.”
